

## **TURNEY, Douglas Howard "Doug"**

Douglas Howard Turney, 76 year old resident of Fort Smith, Arkansas, passed away, on November 25, 1994. He was of the Methodist faith and a retired Real Estate Broker - Soil Conservation Service USDA in 1961.

Mr. Turney served in the Oklahoma National Guard 180 INF 1937-39, United States Navy WWII - wounded in the battle to retake the Island of Guam. He was discharged from San Diego Naval Hospital in 1945. Mr. Turney was recalled to service; by the U. S. Army during the Korean Conflict, where he served in Germany. He was discharged in 1957 at the rank of Captain.

Mr. Turney was born August 17, 1918, in Frogville, Oklahoma, to James Bowman and Ida Lue (Patterson) Turney. He married Kyung Soon Grenzebach in 1993 in Ft. Smith, Arkansas. He worked for the Soil Conservation before and after serving in the Armed Forces. After retirement he operated his real estate business in the Talihina area.

Surviving relatives include his wife Kyung Soon; two brothers Hardin Lewin (Cotton) Turney of Seattle, Washington and Joseph Bowman Turney of Hugo; three daughters Candida Marie Monnet of Oklahoma City, and Anna Marie Nevok of Broken Arrow and Mary Agnes Russell of Dallas; one son Carl Douglas Turney of Ft. Smith; 13 grandchildren and 7 great-grandchildren.

Service was held November 29, 1994 at 2 p.m. in; the Lampton-Mills & Coffey Chapel. Reverend Randall Crumley officiated.: Interment was in the Mount Olivet Cemetery.
